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The Motion For Attorneys' Fees, Cost Reimbursement, Incentive Awards, and Approval of Settlement Administration Expenses came on for hearing before this Court, the Honorable William F. Highberger, presiding, on July 26 and 28, 2023. The Court having considered all submissions and arguments with respect to the Motion, the Court HEREBY ORDERS THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. The Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this action, the Plaintiffs, the Settlement Class as defined in the Second Class Action Settlement Agreement filed on February 27, 2023 as Exhibit 1 to the Declaration of Gretchen Nelson, (the "Second Settlement Agreement" or "Second Settlement"), and the Defendant.
- 2. Pursuant to the Court's March 10, 2023 Order Granting Preliminary Approval of Class Action Settlement, the Notice was sent to each Settlement Class Member by first-class mail and by email to Settlement Class Members for whom email addresses were provided. The Notice informed the Settlement Class Members regarding (i) the terms of the Settlement and that CalPERS would pay an additional \$80 million to pay unreimbursed costs incurred by Class Counsel in the prosecution of this matter, which were estimated to be no more than \$2.5 million; Service Awards to the Plaintiffs of no more than \$85,000 in total; Settlement Administration Expenses for the Prior and Second Settlement, which were estimated to be \$5 million; and attorneys' fees of no more than \$73 million; (ii) their right to object or to elect not to participate in the Settlement and pursue their own remedies; and (iii) their right to appear in person or by counsel at the final approval hearing and be heard regarding approval of the Settlement. 50 Participating Settlement Class Members filed written objections to the proposed Settlement as part of this notice period or stated an intention to appear at the final approval hearing and the Court heard and considered additional objections and comments from Participating Settlement Class Members at the hearings on July 26 and 28, 2023.
- 3. The Court finds and determines that this notice procedure afforded adequate protections to the Settlement Class and provides the basis for the Court to make an informed

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decision regarding the request for attorneys' fees, reimbursement of costs, settlement administration expenses, and Service Awards for the Plaintiffs.

- The Court overrules the objections raised by Participating Settlement Class
- The Court grants the motion and hereby awards \$72,142,875.60 in attorneys' fees to Class Counsel, reimbursement of their costs in the amount of \$2,271,634.82, reimbursement of \$5,500,488.89 in Settlement Administration costs to Epiq Class Action and Claims Solutions, Inc., and an award in the amount of \$85,000 in total to the named Plaintiffs in Service Awards (of this amount, Holly Wedding will receive \$35,000 and Eileen and Richard Lodyga will each receive \$25,000). The foregoing shall be paid from the \$80 million to be paid by CalPERS for the payment of attorneys' fees, costs, expenses, Service Awards and Settlement Administration expenses. Any costs or administration expenses over and above those identified herein are to be paid by Class Counsel. The payment of these fees, costs, expenses, and awards will not reduce the payments due to Participating Settlement Class Members.
- Nothing in this Order will preclude any action to enforce the Parties' obligations under the Settlement or under this Order, including the requirement that CalPERS fund the Settlement Account in accordance with the Settlement.
- Without affecting the finality of this Order in any way, the Court retains jurisdiction of all matters relating to the interpretation, administration, implementation, effectuation and enforcement of this Order and the Settlement.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
